



## **Central Dauphin Band Boosters Association**

Meeting Minutes – Wednesday, June 3, 2009

President Eric Bloom called the meeting to order at 7:30 pm. Eric introduced himself and welcomed the incoming Freshmen and their parents. Eric then introduced Mr. Ceresini. Mr. C also welcomed the Freshmen students and their parents and told them he was excited to have them at CD. Mr. Ceresini described the nine band ensembles: Marching Band, Symphonic Band, Wind Ensemble, Jazz I and II, Percussion Ensemble, Indoor Majorettes, Indoor Drumline and Indoor Guard and spoke about their respective events. He introduced Amy Detrick, the Assistant Band Director, who will work with the Marching Band. Amy is a recent graduate of Lebanon Valley College. Mr. Ceresini also explained grading, attendance and other policies. He mentioned that there are honor bands such as County and District Bands. Mr. C also pointed at the Band Directory which is a valuable resource. He then had a question and answer session. One of the questions he addressed was the time commitment. Mr. Ceresini said that it is possible to participate in one or more bands and still be involved in other activities and maintain good grades. Mr. Ceresini ended his discussion by explaining the important role the Band Boosters have in the Band program. The Freshmen students then went with the upperclassman for the current students' perspective on the band programs. Next Eric explained how the Booster Association helps the band. One of our goals is to raise money for Mr. Ceresini's Wish List. Some recent equipment purchases provided by the Boosters were on display. These purchases included a marimba, vibraphone and new marching band drums. This equipment benefits all the bands not just the Marching Band. Eric noted that the Boosters expended approximately \$25,000 over the past few years for equipment on Mr. C's Wish List. The Boosters also pay for staff and logistics, provide food and host many events. At this point, Eric introduced the Executive Committee: Band Director – Matt Ceresini; President – Eric Bloom; Vice-President – Diane Baker; Treasurer – Jolene Yaede; Financial Secretary – Tim Clouser and Recording Secretary – Sue Douma. Next Eric highlighted our website at [www.cdramband.org](http://www.cdramband.org). He pointed out some of the various features of the website, ex: What's New, Pictures, Calendar, etc. Eric said that the website is the way to keep in touch with the RamBand program. Email blasts are also used to communicate. Eric then stressed how important it is for each family to participate in the program and even better, to become a Booster member. He explained the Enrollment Form which also includes a Volunteer Sign Up form and approval for your student and family to be included in the Band Directory. Eric said that the Membership goal for 2009-10 is 100%. The Boosters need many volunteers. No matter what your time or skills there is something you can do to help our Band program. Upcoming volunteer needs are Band Camp, Landis Field Concessions and Band Fair/Pigskin Preview. Student Accounts were then discussed and explained. The way to get funds into your student's account is by Business Sponsorships, Scrip (which Dr. Bloom was available after the meeting to explain), HERCO & GTP opportunities and Product Sales. Student Account withdrawals can be used for band related expenses – trip, event tickets, band shoes, lessons, instruments and repairs. Eric ended the Freshmen Orientation part of the meeting by having a questions and answers session.

Next, the Treasurer's report was presented but not passed pending final audit. This report shows revenues and expenses for the month. The Financial Secretary's report was presented. This

report lists the financial information by event. The Recording Secretary's Report was reviewed and passed on the motions of Dr. Mark Guise and Diane Baker.

**Vice-President's Report:** Nothing reported.

**Mr. Ceresini's Report:** Mr. Ceresini said the Linglestown Memorial Day parade went well. The Marching Band's participation in the parade was very much appreciated by the community. Mr. C received several positive emails one of which is highlighted in the June Ram-a-Gram. The Band Banquet was last Friday and was held in the cafeteria. The presentations, awards and slide show were in the auditorium. Mr. Ceresini said that the evening was very nice and it was great to honor the seniors. Graduation was last evening and the Symphonic Band and Wind Ensemble played very good. Mr. C said that the Student Leaders and Band Officers for 2009-10 have been selected. The list of Student Leaders and Band Officers can be found in the June Ram-a-Gram. Mr. Ceresini said that approximately 70 freshman will participate in the 2009-10 band programs! There will also be a freshman orientation tomorrow night since CDMS had a National Junior Honor Society program this evening.

#### **Old Business:**

**Golf-a-RAM-a (June 11, 2009) – Mark Guise, Hal Hammaker and Jenifer Donnelly.** This event will be held at the Deer Valley Golf Course with a shotgun start at noon. The cost is \$75 per player which includes grounds fees, cart, strip steak dinner and giveaways. There will be exciting prizes for everyone. It's not too late to sign up and you don't need a foursome; however, Mark would like to know by Friday or Saturday if you are interested in participating. The car this year for the Hole-In-One Contest will be a Saturn (free lease for one year). There may also be a Harley Davidson motorcycle. Non golfers can participate in the dinner after the tournament for \$25. We also still need businesses or groups (Majorettes and Drumline did this last year) to sponsor holes. **Phillies Game (August 19, 2009) –** We have section 304 (right field, Pavilion Deck, 200 seats) reserved. Some tickets in the student section are still available for \$18; however, you must find your own transportation unless you are a chaperone. The order form is online and in the June Ram-a-Gram. The Boosters are paying for the students' tickets. The Marching Band will be playing on the field before the game. [NB: Section 304 seats are gone. We now have limited seats in Section 308 for \$22.00]

**Band Fair/Pigskin Preview – September 2, 2009 –** We need a coordinator! [NB: Janice Mountain has since volunteered to coordinate] The Event Head coordinates games, displays, volunteers, etc. The Landis Field Grillin' Pit will handle the food. Mr. C will handle the emceeing and performance schedule.

**28<sup>th</sup> Annual Band-a-RAM-a 2009 (September 19, 2009) - Kathie Christie –** This is a Marching Band Exhibition held at Landis Field that has been a CD tradition since 1982! The RamBand and the **East High Marching Panthers** participate as well as visiting bands. William Penn (York), Wyomissing, and Steel High have already accepted. Northeastern and Kennard-Dale previously requested to participate. Last year we hosted East, Dallastown, Shippensburg and Waynesboro. Mr. C is focusing on getting a few more York county bands (Dover and Southwestern). We would also like to have one or two college bands such as IUP, LVC, Shippensburg, Gettysburg, or Mansfield.

**Artie Shaw Orchestra Concert (October 20, 2009) –** We need someone to volunteer to be the Event Head.

**2009-10 Budget Review and Approval** – The budget was reviewed and passed on the motions of Jeff Imboden and Belinda Clouser.

**Band Trip Update – Disney 2010 -Sue Kruleski, Sue Kinneer and Denise Hess** – The all-band trip to Orlando, Florida is Wednesday, March 31 through Monday, April 5, 2010. This is Easter break. We are hoping to have two performances in Disney. The Marching Band and concert band will perform in Downtown Disney. The concert students not in Marching Band will get uniforms, learn the parade song and be taught to march. The Marching Band students not in concert band will perform with the concert band. The band will also do a workshop with a Disney educator. They will play along with a Disney soundtrack and get a DVD. We are also trying to get a workshop for the Bandfront. The price includes all meals in Disney (one meal at the Rainforest Café and one at Medieval Times; the rest are vouchers) and breakfasts at the hotel. The hotel has suites with eight students per suite. The price is \$749 per student (8/suite) and \$829 per adult (four/suite). There will be a separate parent bus. The initial deposit of \$100 is due by September 25<sup>th</sup>. This trip is not mandatory and is open to any student who participates in a RamBand performing unit.
